



The alleged purpose of hemp legalization

- Both during the 2018 Farm Bill and AB 45 the authors said the intent was to ONLY legalize CBD and non-intoxicating hemp products
- That wasn't what happened

Health Effects

- Large increases in California and nationally in poisonings of young children by intoxicating hemp and cannabis edibles, including ICU stays and rare deaths
- Researchers at USC have found that over half of CA 10th graders using cannabis products are starting with hemp products

Current Legal Situation

- Children of any age can legally buy intoxicating hemp products in CA
- Intoxicating hemp products can be sold anywhere, although seen mostly at smoke and vape shops, gas stations, convenience stores, often right next to schools
- Intoxicating edible products made with Delta-9-THC are fully legal and can have far more THC than a legal cannabis edible
- Inhalable products are currently illegal
- CDPH FAQs hold that all the artificially derived THCs (like Delta-8) are illegal, but they have not issued regulations on this topic
- Enforcement is almost non-existent
- CDPH has failed to use its regulatory authority to set age limits or stop intoxicating products

Local Action on Hemp

Why is Local Action Needed?

- The State has failed to use its regulatory authority to protect children or other consumers from dangerous intoxicating hemp compounds
- The original intent of the Farm Bill and the implication of AB45 was that it would only allow non-intoxicating products, but poor drafting and creative chemistry lead to another reality
- Children, youth and unwary consumers are exposed daily to intoxicating products, often in much higher doses than legal cannabis edibles, or with unsafe chemically contrived THC cannabinoids

Can a California locality prohibit the sale of foods/supplements that have hemp-derived cannabinoids?

I see nothing that would preempt local control and we have a history of regulating thing sold in head shops before the state does. Bath salts comes to mind.

"Absent a clear intent to preempt local regulation, California localities enjoy broad home rule police powers under the California constitution that they can use to promote the health, safety, and welfare of their communities. Because AB45 does not manifest a clear intent to preempt local regulation of industrial hemp, California localities likely have the authority to prohibit the sale of foods/supplements that have hemp-derived cannabinoids or non-GRAS components.

Model Local Hemp Ordinance – Key Points

- Prohibits sale/delivery of intoxicating hemp products (>1mg per package of intoxicating cannabinoids or 0.5mg per serving) outside legal cannabis retailers (leaves discussion of cannabis retailers for another day)
- Clearly prohibit the sale/delivery of artificially derived cannabinoids (Delta-8-THC, Delta-10 THC, HHC, THC-O, THC-P, etc)
- Requires age 21+ to purchase hemp derived cannabinoid products, including CBD for ingestion
- Prohibits inhaled hemp products & products attractive to children

SUBJECT: Sale of Intoxicating Hemp

To Whom it May Concern:

The State of California allows for the sale of cannabis and cannabis-derived products only in compliance with specific regulatory and licensing requirements. In addition, City of San Diego regulations require businesses that sell cannabis or cannabis-derived products to have a specific cannabis retailer license allowing such sales.

National poison control centers have received numerous cases of synthetically derived "hemp-based" product exposures causing hospitalizations and deaths. Additionally, under no circumstances may canabis or canabis products be solito minions. The Cripha season to beliuve that businesses are selling such products to minions as young as 16-31 years of age. Selling cannabis to a minor is a felony offense pursuant to health and Safety Code section 136(b)).

The City requests that you dispose of any cannabis products or unlawful hemp products or surrender them to the San Diego Police Department for disposal within the next 30 days. Enforcement action may be taken, as appropriate, 30 days after this notice.

- Start enforcing against illegal activity by tobacco licensees or other licensed business selling products which are already illegal (inhalable, unregistered or with artificial cannabinoids)
 - Example San Diego County and cities recent cease and desist letter
- Consider zoning prohibitions especially near schools
- Educate the community
